

Bacon

1747 May 16 (Saturday). Captain Maynard breakfasts here on Bacon etc.

1755 September 3 (Wednesday). The ministers (most of us) went to Mount Wachusett. Mrs. Mellen and her Sister Robbins with us and Mrs. Mellen had a Fall from her Horse but recover'd. We refresh'd ourselves on the Top of the Mount, Having carry'd up Bacon, Bread and Cheese, Rum.

1765 April 12 (Friday). Mr. *Caleb Hitchcock* of the Union, here, and o' foot. Wants a Cast upon my Horse part of his Way. I complied and let him have my mare as far as William Wards. John went afterwards o' foot to bring her back -- but goes to Marlborough and brings home some Leggs of *Bacon* from Deacon Woods.

1767 March 17 (Tuesday). I have lent Mrs. *Johnson* my Mare for her John [Arnold?] to go with a Cart, to Marlborough and Southborough. Carrys 4 Leggs of Pork to Deacon Woods Malt House, for Bacon.

1768 June 10 (Friday). Presently Mr. John Langdon junior brings *Suse* from Boston, and at Eve *Alexander* goes to Marlborough and brings our Bacon from Deacon Woods's.

1775 February 18 (Saturday). Elias goes with Three Legs of Pork to Mr. S. *Allens* for Bacon.

1776 March 22 (Friday). Elias goes to *Samuel Allens* with 3 Legs for Bacon.

1781 January 16 (Tuesday). *Benjamin Wood* rode to Mr. *Samuel Allens* to carry Six Leggs of Pork to be baconed: and brought home a Piece of woollen Cloth for my wearing, from Capt. *Maynards*: being [*blank*] yards.

1781 March 8 (Thursday). *Stephen Maynard* brings home Mr. Allens 5 Leggs and 2 Chops of Bacon.
