

Dr. Moses Baker (d. 1781) of Braintree

1760 February 4 (Monday). My Wife probably hurts her Health by her rising so much before Day. Yet I highly commend and am used to early rising. Dr. Moses Baker here p.m.

1760 October 16 (Thursday). Mr. Fessenden and Dr. Baker here, at Tea.

Settled in the south precinct of Braintree (now Randolph) in 1755; died in 1781. Charles Francis Adams suggests that he might have been a party in a case of fornication.
