1727 March 15 (Wednesday). In the Evening I was at Mr. Greenwoods Lecture which was upon Projectile Motion. I can't but Conclude these Exercises by Experiments are the most beneficial as they Reduce all to Sensible Demonstration. When I return'd I went in with Mr. Greenwood to Dr. Clarks. [Not clear whether this was John or William.]

1746 May 27 (Tuesday). Mr. Francis Whipple the Representative was with me, and we thence prosecuted our Journey for Cambridge and Boston.... We stopp'd at Saltmarsh's -- and then many more; Brigadier Dwight, Colonel Porter, Mr. Breck, Mr. Chester Williams. Afterwards Dr. **William Clark** of Boston etc. I proceeded as far as Cambridge and lodg'd at Mother Champneys.
