

## Ewes

1737 March 16 (Wednesday). N.B. An ewe that was gored very ill -- fine pleasant Day.

1737 March 17 (Thursday). Trouble with my sick ewe.

1738 December 8 (Friday). N.B. In my absence a good Ewe (that which Mr. Ball presented me at the Setting up my Flock) fell into the old House Cellar and dy'd there.

1739 April 2 (Monday). Lost Two Ewes, one yesterday, the other to Day.

1745 April 1 (Monday). Trouble in my neighbourhood respecting Sheep hurt by Doggs. As Ewe and Lamb of mine in all likelihood kill'd.

1745 April 12 (Friday). Last night our Small Flock of Sheep Sett on by Doggs. A principal Ewe lay Dead, and mostly Eat up: her Lamb left to be brought up by Hand. A Weather also much bitt, that we much doubted of its Life.

1749 August 15 (Tuesday). N.B. Ebenezer Maynard here and kill'd a Ewe for me.

1750 January 8 (Monday). Mr. Jeduthun Fay came and bought seven Sheep of me, (3 of them Lucy's) for 12£ old Tenor and took a poor Ewe with Lamb to winter for me.

1772 April 10 (Friday). Mr. Taylor came, informs of the remarkable Occurrence at Squire Whipples of a Ewe's yeaning two Lambs which dyed soon, and then in three weeks wanting 3 Dayes bringing three more, two of which live.
