

Dr. Daniel Greenleaf (1702-1795) of Bolton

Walett identifies him as Daniel Greenleaf, a physician of Boston, citing James E. Greenleaf, *Genealogy of the Greenleaf Family* (Boston, 1896), 206-07.

But it's not clear what a Boston physician was doing in the Westborough area.

Shipton's sketch of Daniel Greenleaf, Harvard 1699 (1680-1763), contains nothing that would indicate that he practiced in or visited the Westborough area; SHG 4:472-76. He had a son Stephen, Harvard 1723, who similarly had no connection with central Massachusetts.

It is more likely that this was Dr. Daniel Greenleaf, son of Rev. Daniel (Harvard 1699), 1702-1795, who "Removed from Hingham to Bolton, Mass., probably 1732." Greenleaf, *Genealogy of the Greenleaf Family*, 205-06.

1747 September 29 (Tuesday). P.M. visited Stephen Maynard. N.B. Dr. Greenleaf there to see him.

1747 October 5 (Monday). Visited Stephen Maynard and was at Mr. Hows.... Lieutenant Tainter return'd a Blanket which Captain Maynard borrow'd for Stephen when a Soldier.

1747 October 16 (Friday). Was at Neighbour Pratts, and Maynards about the making Cyder -- send Ebenezer again to go on with it and went to Mr. Batchellor and got him to rig up my Casks -- visited Neighbour Stephen Maynard who is ill yet.

1748 September 17 (Saturday). Visited Mrs. Warrin and the Lads there who are sick yet. Dr. Greenleaf there.

1755 September 27 (Saturday). Call'd away at Night to visit Elijah Rice's Wife (who now live within Upton Bounds). She had been deliver'd of one Child, which was living; but there was another of which She could not be deliver'd. They had Mrs. Forbush and Mrs. Clark -- and had Sent to Dr. Greenleaf.

1758 April 7 (Friday). Granny Maynard being sick and prayed for Yesterday, I went to See her - - found her very ill. Doctors Greenleaf and Crosby there.
