1777 September 11 (Thursday). I went to Mr. J. *Bonds* and to [*torn*] *ons* to see what they have done in making the [*torn*] of Molasses, and I visited old Mrs. *Kelly*.

1777 September 23 (Tuesday). Mrs. P _____ brews with Spruce and Corn stalks instead of Molasses.
