1723 August 28 (Wednesday). I went out a hunting with Mr. Barrett, a Young Faun having been Seen not long Since -- and Flocks of Turkeys. We Search'd the woods but Saw Nothing but Pigeons. We brought home Seven or Eight of Those.

Thence I rode to Mr. Woods. Thence to Mr. Cooks where I din'd on fry'd Pigeons. Thence to Livermores, from whence to Father Champney's.

1726 August 22 (Monday). So many of my Friends absent I was very lonely. I walk'd down to Neighbour Greens. I read miscellaneously. I kill'd 8 Pidgeons (and how many more I know not) at a shot.

1747 August 14 (Friday). Mr. Williams brought us the first pidgeons which he has caught or which we have seen this Year. Ebenezer went to Deacon Newtons for 6 Bushels of Lime, repos'd there, but brings only one Bushel and half.

1749 August 18 (Friday). Daniel setts his Pidgeon Net, but without any Success.

1755 August 27 (Wednesday). Remarkable Plenty Pidgeons -- the Neighbours take them in their Netts in great Numbers.

1757 August 23 (Tuesday). *Adam Rice* setts his Nett in my Field, and catches Pidgeons, about 4 Dozen this forenoon.

1758 April 7 (Friday). N.B. Extraordinary Flocks of Pidgeons.
