

Stilling

1740 August 29 (Friday). I undertook my Journey home. Call'd at Mr. John Hunts at Watertown (who has lately set up a Still House there).

1748 July 13 (Wednesday). Visited at Mr. Millers, Mr. Daniel Forbush, Solomon Woods (by whom I sent for my still at Deacon Drowns at Boston) and Mr. Bowmans.

1748 October 4 (Tuesday). Aaron Warrin works here. My wife began to still Cyder, having borrow'd a large Iron Pott of Mr. Eliezer Rice for that Purpose.

1748 October 5 (Wednesday). My Wife stilling.

1752 August 25 (Tuesday). My Wife watch'd. The forenoon was of apiece with the Morning. My wife stills a miscellany of Meat, Herbs, Roots, seeds etc. by the Doctor's Direction. But my Eye and Heart are to God to Show Mercy. Dr. Chase waits upon his Father here. P.M. I was more lively and comfortable. D.G. Very free of pain -- a better Evening and Night.

1752 August 26 (Wednesday). My wife tends me o'nights and supply's me with Breast-Milk.

1777 July 30 (Wednesday). A *Still* from a Lambs Entrals, for *Hannah* brought from Mrs. (*Jeduthun*) Fay.

1777 October 2 (Thursday). At night came Mr. *Cornelius Waters* and a young Gentleman, an *Hazzletine* with him, of Dartmouth College, but I was in so much trouble about my Daughter, and my pasture so gnawed up, that I could not freely ask them to tarry all night, though I did repeatedly urge them to stay to sup here. N.B. Mr. *Waters* has a Specimen of an excellent Spirituous Liquor distilled at *Salem* from indian Corn Stalks.
