

## **Misco, Christian (widow of old George Misco): died, 1746**

1746 June 25 (Wednesday). I visited Lieutenant Tainter<sup>1</sup> and his Family in their Distress for Benjamin, who, as they conclude, is carry'd away Captive by the Indians. Captain Maynard brought old Christian (Squa Widow of George Misco) from Grafton to dwell at his House.

1746 October 10 (Friday). N.B. Christian, the Widow of Old George Misco, Indian, expir'd.

1746 October 12 (Sunday). I with my wife went to the Funeral of old Christian. She was bury'd in a very decent manner by Captain Maynard, from his house. Samuel Brigham Esquire, Edward Baker Esquire, Captain Timothy Brigham, Messrs. Jotham and Charles Brigham and many others (besides a Number of Indians) attended. She was carry'd to our South Burying Place.
