Dr. William Crawford (1730-1776) of Worcester

1754 September 19 (Thursday). Was at Colonel Chandlers Office.... I call'd at Mr. Dyars -- din'd at Dr. Crawfords. N.B. his son William at Learning.

1756 June 15 (Tuesday). I rode to Ministers Meeting at Mr. *Morse's...*. Sir *Crawford* offered himself to be examined. See the Association minutes.

1756 June 16 (Wednesday). Sir Crawford brought us a Letter from Mr. *Maccarty*, and one that Mr. Maccarty had sent to Coll. *Chandler*; on which also that Coll. had written his own Recommendation of him to the Gentlemen who were empowered to put in Chaplains in the Army. In brief, a Certificat was drawn, and I suppose signed, according to Vote, by the Moderator.

1756 July 21 (Wednesday). Nigh Evening came Mr. William Crawford. This was to my great Ease and Comfort. Sent his Horse to Neighbour Barny Newtons, to be kept.

1756 July 22 (Thursday). *Publick Fast* on Account of our undertaking against Crown Point. Mr. *Crawford* preached a.m. on Hos. 6.6. I went to Meeting -- D.G. And prayed after sermon. P.M. I prayed before sermon. Mr. Crawford preached on *Deuteronomy* 23.9. I hope I got no Cold, nor received any Harm. The Lord hear and accept the Addresses; pardoning our many Offences; and may the word delivered have a proper Effect!

1756 July 23 (Friday). Mr. Crawford returned home.

1756 September 5 (Sunday). I have taken a late Cold and am much oppressed with it: was full of Hopes through the Week, of Preaching to Day, and therefore was fully prepared, as to Sermons composed; but now when the Day is come am so hoarse, and many ways so indisposed that I was all the Morning in great Concern what to do -- till Mr. *Cushing* (So God was pleased in his good Providence to Order it) appeared in Sight -- for he having got Mr. *Crawford* to preach for him, was come to help me; for which I was heartily thankfull.

1756 September 12 (Sunday). Mr. Hutchinsons Pulpit Supplyed by Sir Crawford, he comes to my help as he had writ but he lodged at *Esq. Bakers* last night and came here in the Morning. I went to meeting.

1756 October 20 (Wednesday). P.M. Mr. *Hutchinson* here, returning from a Fast at Framingham. N.B. his Talk about Mr. *William Crawford*.

1756 December 3 (Friday). Mr. Forb. to Brookfield. Returned by him Sir Crawfords 1st Vol. of Art of Pleasing in Conversation.

1757 August 31 (Wednesday). N.B. Some persons who have come from the Forts, have the Small Pox: In *Shrewsbury* one has lately dyed of it, and another is Sick of it. Mr. William *Crawford* at Worcester, is Sick of it.

1760 January 30 (Wednesday). After Tea (where our Company was young Dr. William Crawford and two young Ladies with him, besides Mrs. *Pain*) I complyed -- and wrote also to Mr. Forb. at Boston to wait upon the Judge; and wrap up both to Esq. Pain who is there also. All to be sent per Coll. *Gendley* as *Crawford* tells me.
