

Peaches

1736 September 21 (Tuesday). Returned by Mr. Walkers and was in at Mr. Tainters -- Peaches here but a great Rarity with us.

1754 February 28 (Thursday). Mrs. Parkman to t'other House, She not having been there ever since Peach Time till now. Such is her Encumbrance by the Children and Business of the Family.

1764 September 19 (Wednesday). P.M. I rode to Mr. Tainters. N.B. Great Plenty of Peaches there. I brought home many for Pickling.

1766 September 16 (Tuesday). At Evening came Mr. Tainter and his Wife. They brought a present of Peaches. He had appointed to reckon yesterday, but he did not come Seasonably; therefore it was unavoidable to Night (unless I had too much exposed my Self). He paid me all - and I gave him a Receipt for £166.13.4. N.B. No Word passed, of any *Andrews* Matter.

1777 September 24 (Wednesday). Mr. *Tainter* brought Peaches and Plums. Cut 3 Pigs and a Calf, gratis. Dined here.
