Veal

1736 June 28 (Monday). I rode into the South Part of the Town. Bought Quarter of Veal of Neighbour James Fay, thinking that Some Ministers would call to Morrow in their Journey to Leicester to Ordination.

1739 May 8 (Tuesday). N.B. Neighbor How brought us a Quarter of Veal.

1739 June 23 (Saturday). I was at Abner Newtons and hit [?] of some Veal which was very agreeable on account of my Friends of New Haven who were still at my House.

1749 June 17 (Saturday). After a very ill night I rose somewhat comfortable. Blessed be God! The prospects abroad extremely Melancholly and sorrowful. My people mowing -- but yet next to nothing for their pains. I gave them order to fence off Some of the Ground for pasture. Mr. Samuel Harrington here with veal, a present to me -- which was very acceptable -- my Stomach being very poor. Very Hot Time -- as if we should be burnt up with the Drought. I was little more than hanging about all Day.

1751 March 2 (Saturday). Lieutenant Tainter here, who carry'd a Veal for us to Boston.

1751 May 9 (Thursday). Patty Pannell, brought a present, of a Quarter of Veal from the Widow Tomlins with whom she lives.

1751 September 4 (Wednesday). Ebenezer has kill'd some Veal and brought us a part.

1755 June 27 (Friday). At Eve Captain Maynard Sent Quarter Veal and Several Pounds of Butter -- all this was given freely.

1755 August 25 (Monday). Lieutenant Tainter Carry'd to Boston 2 hind Quarters of Veal for me to some Friends there -- Mr. Solomon Woods kill'd it -- and took a Quarter for him and Lieutenant Tainter in token of Gratitude to them both.

1756 August 2 (Monday). Am Seized in my left Knee and especially my left Foot. This gives a great Addition to my sorrow. The Lord Support me under this grievous Evil! And fitt me for what I have yet to undergo! My right foot is somewhat easier. D.G. But my Right Hand is worse -- so that I write any Thing with great Difficulty.

P.M. Capt. Benjamin Wood, of Hopkinton Sent his son with a present of Rum, Veal, etc. Mrs. Rolf, and Mrs. Lucy Forb. visit: the latter Shaved me.

1757 June 8 (Wednesday). Capt. Baldwin (who came a Little after Midnight) to Day takes his Wife out in a Chair, and they ride over to Mr. *Martyns* -- and return at Evening. P.M. came his Father and Mother; and at Evening his Uncle *Samuel* (with whom he served apprenticeship). They Supped and lodged here. I would view the kind Hand of Providence that when I was

Somewhat put to't for fresh Meat, Mr. *Maynard* kindly Sent me a Quarter of veal and some Butter. Mrs. *Dolly Rice* an old Cheese.

1758 June 22 (Thursday). P.M. Called at Capt. Nat. Allens but his wife and sister were gone to my House. N.B. they carryed Veal etc. to make them Selves Welcome. I arrived a little before Sunsetting.

1758 August 14 (Monday). Capt. Wood Sent me a good Quarter of Veal -- but his Wife being gone to see her sister Oake, I had the Captain and Dr. Rice to dine with me.

1760 July 21 (Monday). Capt. Maynard here p.m. with a Quarter of Veal, etc.

1766 March 25 (Tuesday). N.B. I bought an extraordinary Quarter of Veal of Deacon Batchellor -- weighted 25 1/2 lb. @ 20d per pound.

1769 June 6 (Tuesday). Read London Magazine for January and Send it to Mr. *Mein* again, by Mr. Thomas *Twitchell*, of whom I bought a small fore quarter of Veal, weight 11 1/2.

1779 August 2 (Monday). Mr. Joseph Harrington has brought a Loin of Veal, which I would take a grateful notice of.
