Dr. Nahum Willard (1733-1792) of Worcester

According to Lincoln's history of Worcester, Willard was born in Lancaster, 1733; probably settled in Worcester about 1755; and removed to Uxbridge after the Revolution; he died in 1792.

1764 August 5 (Sunday). [Worcester.] Mr. *Maccarty* goes to *Oxford*, for Mr. *Bowman*, who preaches for me, and I for Mr. *Maccarty*.... At Eve Mr. *Maccarty* returned from Oxford, but I tarried where I was.

1764 August 6 (Monday). In the Morning Mr. M. and I walked to Dr. *Willards*. N.B. he has lately bought *Universal History* in 21 Volumes.

1773 September 23 (Thursday). We returned to *Worcester*.... I was at Mr. *Putnams*, Dr. *Willards*, at Judge *Chandlers*.
