

Cornelius Cook, Jr. (b. 1732)

Cornelius, son of Cornelius and Eunice Cook, b. Mar. 30, 1732 (WVR 35)

1748 October 12 (Wednesday). Mr. Hezekiah Pratt afforded me the help of his Boy Cornelius Cook and his Team to get up the Corn from the barn. Ebenezer and Cornelius hard at it all Day.

1750 February 15 (Thursday). N.B. Mr. Pratt kindly Sent Cornelius Cook to cutt wood at the Door.

1750 September 5 (Wednesday). N.B. Ebenezer and Mr. Eliezer Rice's son Silas carted Stones and Mr. Pratt Sent Cornelius Cook to digg them.

1750 October 17 (Wednesday). P.M. at the New House desir'd Rody Smith to ask Mr. Barns to come and husk to night. A Number were ask'd, but there were but six only who came, scil. Neighbour Benjamin How and his Brother Daniel, Neighbour John Frost and Samuel Forbush, Cornelius Cook and John Pratt.

1750 November 9 (Friday). Early in the Morning went from Ensign Millers to Mr. Bowman, who was further reviv'd. Discours'd and pray'd with him -- and went to my New House where Messrs. Forbush and Newton were at work: and my two sons with Cornelius Cook tending them.

1751 August 9 (Friday). At the New House. Deacon Kimball, and his Son Ebenezer lay on the Plaistering. Cornelius Cook tends them.

1752 April 23 (Thursday). Mr. Edward Wilson came, and at last finished the Topping out of my Chimney -- had Cornelius Cook for a Tender.

1752 April 24 (Friday). Ebenezer brought over a Load of Clay from Mr. Hows hither; Mr. Willson came again, to plaister the Chimney; and Cornelius Cook tended. They work'd from a little before noon till Evening -- paid Mr. Willson 40/ old Tenor in part.

1752 May 7 (Thursday). Cornelius Cook (on Mr. Hezekiah Pratt's Account) work'd for me in carting out some Muck and ploughing at my Island.

1752 July 6 (Monday). Mr. Martyn Pratt work'd for me a.m. and Cornelius Cook for Mr. Hezekiah Pratt till past 10 o'Clock a.m. We got our Hay from the Island -- it amounted to one good Load -- and we secur'd it in the Barn.
