

Solomon Bathrick (1746-1824)

Born: 22 April 1746
son of David and Lydia (Maynard) Batherick
Died: 27 August 1824 (Westborough VR 228)

(1) Married: int. Miriam Beeman, May 9, 1772 (Westborough VR 121)

Born: Jan. 26, 1753
daughter of Abraham and Miriam Beeman
Died: Oct. 6, 1775 (EP diary)

(2) Married: widow Thankfull (How) Warren, Oct. 7, 1778 (Westborough VR 121)

This was the widow of Timothy Warren (they mar. May 26, 1767 (Westborough VR 171); he died Jan. 9, 1776 (EP diary, Jan. 9-10, 1776)
She had two children, Noah and Eli, baptized June 23, 1776 (Westborough CR 173 [incorrectly given as May 23 in Westborough VR 103-04]).

1769 March 24 (Friday). John and Jonas Kenny with my Team and Mr. Nurse's fetch [*blank*]
Posts from the ministerial Lot. They were got out by Solomon Batherick.

1770 March 5 (Monday). *Town Meet*. Was desired to go and pray with them which I did; and after Prayer I, from the stairs, Spoke to them, wishing the Presence of God and good Success, that they might have Wisdom and unanimity. I gave Charge that those who were to be Sworn, would fear the Oath, and take heed to perform that Act of worship in Spirit and in Truth. Also would observe to them the growing Evil of resorting to the Tavern and prayed they would not any more than was necessary. I took this Opportunity, moreover, to manifest my Gratitude for their Kindness to me respecting *Wood* -- that with what was already brought and what I had reason further to expect, I believed there would be a good sufficiency for the Year, and would render my Circumstances Comfortable, for which I offered my hearty acknowledgment to them. Gave Notes to sundry persons that I was indebted to.

Viz. To Mr. Seth Morse for Beef and Tallow, £9.1.6 old Tenor.
To Mr. Daniel Stockwell Shoemaker, 12.2.0 Ditto.
To Solomon Batherick for Rails and thrashing, 51/ Do.

1770 April 7 (Saturday). Solomon Batherick came and offered to help me this a.m. gratis. I set him to cut up wood at the Door.

1772 March 17 (Tuesday). The Snow So deep I had Mr. *Isaac Johnson* and Mr. *Ezra Baker* to accompany Me as far as Mr. *Timothy Warrins*, but when I came to the Corner of Mr. *Nurse's* Bridge, the Bank of Snow filled the Road: was forced to go back to Dr. *Hawes* to ask Help. After dining there, the Doctor and *Solomon Batherick* went with Shovels and assisted Me -- so that I arrived here in Safety. D.G.

1772 September 7 (Monday). Breck has a Number of workmen who are Closing, digging, stoning etc. Messrs. Joseph Green junior, [blank] Green of Hopkinton, John Harrington, Nathan Fisher, Joseph Rice, Solomon Batherick, Increase Daniels.

1773 March 16 (Tuesday). Went to See and talk with Solomon *Batheric* and his Wife, they having had a Child too soon. The man not at home. Admonished the woman, calling her to Repentance.

1774 February 11 (Friday). Called at Mr. Solomon Bathericks -- talked closely with them -- instructed them and expected them to Repent etc.

1775 September 4 (Monday). Went also to Mr. Solomon *Bathericks*, who has a Fever.

1775 September 28 (Thursday). Old Mr. *Batherick* came requesting earnestly that I would visit his son *Solomon's* wife, *Miriam*. I went -- found her greatly exercised in Mind -- very humble -- says she is wil[lign?] *to be damned if God* requires it. Prayed with them and composed [them?] in some Measure.

1775 September 29 (Friday). Visit Mrs. *Miriam Batherick* again and prayed there, and Miss *Ann Maynard* at Mr. *Parkers* and prayed.

1775 October 4 (Wednesday). *Hannah* rode with me to See Mrs. *Miriam Batherick* still Sick.

1775 October 6 (Friday). Hear Mrs. *Miriam Batherick* dyed to day about 12 o'Clock....

1775 October 7 (Saturday). P.M. attended the Funeral of Mrs. *Miriam Batherick* (wife of *Solomon Batherick*) and she seems to be much lamented.

1775 October 14 (Saturday). Mrs. *How* (Jonathans Wife) is sick at Mr. *Solomon Bathericks*, I went in to See her; and prayed with *her* likewise.

1775 October 20 (Friday). N.B. Mr. *Solomon Batherick* here to be examined.

1775 November 5 (Sunday). Mr. *Bowen* preached a. and P.M. on Ps. 4.6.7. I we[*torn*] Meeting; prayed after the Sermons, and Officiated in [*torn*] *Solomon Batherick* and admitting him into the Church.

1778 October 7 (Wednesday). Brother Solomon *Batherick* and the Widow *Thankful Warrin* were married.

1779 December 8 (Wednesday). Mr. Samuel Forbush, Mr. Solomon Batheric, and Mr. Nathan Maynard junior came with their Teams and brought Wood. The two former two Load, the latter one.

1779 December 16 (Thursday). Messrs. Forbush and Batheric more wood. Gave the former a Receipt for ten cord. He tells me the Town voted to give 7£ per cord to Four of them 70£ apiece for 10 cord each, viz. Samuel Forbush, Solomon Batheric, Nathan Maynard Junior and Jonathan Maynard, who have undertaken to bring 40 cords.

1780 January 21 (Friday). Mr. Solomon Batherick and his Brother came and killed my principal Hog, which weighed 190.

1781 November 28 (Wednesday). Rode to Mr. Solomon *Bathericks*, to enquire after Wood.
