James, son of John and Elizabeth (Champney) Hicks, b. May 7, 1765. (Cambridge VR, Births, 349)

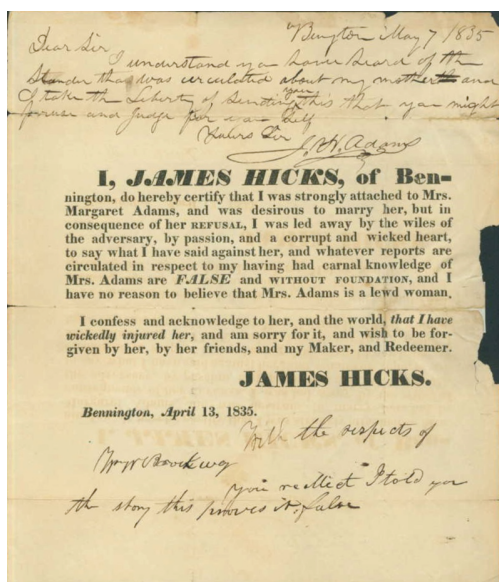
Elizabeth Champney was Molly (Champney) Parkman's sister.

1776 May 3 (Friday). Also here is come *James Hicks* and his Brother *William*¹ and lodge here. *Jeremy* with a View to living with me.

1776 May 11 (Saturday). Mrs. *Hicks*, waited on by her son *Zechary*, brings her son *James* to live with me till he shall be 14 Years old. D.V. They tarry here with us. Being short of Hay, am forced to send her Horse to Mr. *Nurse*'s.

1776 June 20 (Thursday). *Elias* returns to Mr. *Frost* of *Mendon* -- has Squire *Whipple*'s Horse, and *James Hicks* goes to bring him back.

1776 September 15 (Sunday). When *James Hicks* went to the Cow yard for the Cows in the Morning, to drive them to the House to be milked, a young Cow (called the White Face) was

fallen down *dead*, out Side the Cow Yard, an upper Rail down not far from the Place where she lay. Sent for Deacon Wood, who with *Joseph Chamberlin* came [and bleed?] her.

1776 November 2 (Saturday). Sent *James Hicks* with an Horse to meet him. He arrived about noon.

1776 November 7 (Thursday). *James Hicks* goes to *Cambridge*.

1776 November 9 (Saturday). *James Hicks* returned from *Cambridge*.

1776 December 17 (Tuesday). *James Hicks* has cut his Ankle with an Ax when he was at the ministerial Lot with *Williams*.

1777 May 3 (Saturday). *James Hicks's* Hands sore that he can't work.

1777 May 14 (Wednesday). N.B. *James Hicks* so lame by Reason of Sore Cracks in his Feet, that he can do very little service for me.

1777 December 30 (Tuesday). *James Hicks* is exceedingly exercised with chapped Feet and Hands.

1778 May 12 (Tuesday). *James Hicks* drives four young Creatures of my Son *Baldwins*, and four of my own, to go to Pasture, At *Brookfield*.

1778 May 26 (Tuesday). *James Hicks* leaves us, and goes to *Cambridge*. I wrote by him to this Mother.
